Governor Phil Scott announced **\$4 million** in capital funding to enhance school safety funding to focus on:

- Areas of access control and visitor management
- Emergency Notifications
- Interior/exterior locking devices
- Security cameras

- Family Reunification

U.S. Department of Justice awarded Vermont **\$238,000** for the development and delivery of SurviVermont, a critical incident response methodology that blends the Department of Homeland Security's See Something, Say Something; Run/Hide/Fight; and Stop the Bleed.







The Department of Justice also awarded **\$173,000** to Vermont for the development and implementation of an anonymous school safety tipline.

\$1 million of existing federal Homeland Security funding allocated for school crisis planning, training and exercises.



71% of schools use the Vermont School Crisis Guide for their School Emergency Operations Plan.

81% of schools consider those with mobility challenges in their Emergency Operations Plan.

70% of schools have shared building floor plans with local emergency responders.

86% of schools are in the process of developing or have a fully developed Family Reunification Plan.
